

Historic House Research What Records Can Tell You

Following are brief examples of the types of historical data that can be obtained from some of the primary sources discussed in this workshop:

Date of construction for the house was obtained by comparing the Property Abstract, City Directories, Bird's-Eye Map and Sanborn Maps in the following manner:

*We know from the Abstract that the addition in which this house is located (Charles T. Price's Addition) was laid out (Platted) in 1873. The Bird's-Eye Map clearly shows that by 1884 houses were beginning to be built in this neighborhood, but 401 South 14th was still an empty lot.

*The first Sanborn Map on which the property appears is the 1909 edition (the 1896 Sanborn did not show this part of town; therefore, it cannot be used to determine the date of construction). Since the vernacular form of the house and its style (gabled ell/Queen Anne) indicates that it was likely built prior to that time—probably in the 1880s to 1890s—we next followed the “chain of title” from the Abstract (see below) and then determined which owners first appeared at the address on 14th Street from the City Directory.

*John H. Bollinger appears in the 1895-96 edition of the City Directory at this address. We know he purchased the property in 1892 and find that none of the previous owners of the property are listed at this address prior to 1895. We can therefore confidently give 401 South 14th Street a circa (approximately) date of 1895, at least until other documents and/or evidence are found. This date coincides with the style and form of architecture.

Chain of Title

The “chain of title” was obtained by comparing the Abstract of Title with City Directories. The U.S. Census was also used for comparative purposes. The following information shows how the beginnings of a house history can be put together. This date can be compared with later information as it becomes available.

1. 1892-1902: John H. and Ida L. Bolinger

The house was constructed for the Bolingers c.1895 (see above); Bolinger (John) first appears in 1885-86 edition of the City Directory. John was a mail clerk for a railroad company. By 1899 they lived there with their daughter (?) Mable E. The U.S. Census for 1900 shows that the Bolingers lived here with a son named Ray, who was six years old. John was born in Ohio in 1854; Ida was an Indiana native, born in 1860. We find that her parents were born in Germany. We also find that the Bolingers had a mortgage on their residence.

2. 1902-1908 William S. and Parmettie L. Ewry
William was a grocer with a store at 120 Hunt Street in west Richmond. By 1905 he was employed as secretary of the Richmond Abattoir Company, wholesalers of lard, hams and sausage. They had a rear addition and other modernizations constructed at the house.
3. 1908-1915 Daniel O. and Arlie A. North
The North's did not live in the house. The property was probably rented during this period. No one was at home when the U.S. Census taker came to the home, so that information is not available.
4. 1915-1920 Samuel VanSant
VanSant did not live in the house. The property was rented during this period. The U.S. Census for 1920 shows Katherine and Benjamin Gehr as residents. The Gehr's shared the residence with Ollie Crisman, relationship unknown. The census shows that these renters were white and spoke English. Benjamin was employed as a carpenter for a railroad. He was fifty years old; his spouse was forty-seven.
5. 1920-1922 Frank C. and Luda McBride Tillson
The Tillson's lived here briefly and were in the real estate business.
6. 1922-1924 Edward F. and Elvira B. Goebel
Edward was co-owner of the French Benzule Cleaning Company with his office at 1030 Main and the plant at 1114 South F.
7. 1924-1972 Edna Brower
Edna lived here until her death in 1972. The first City Directory listing shows her here with her husband, Stanley J., and another Brower named Samuel J. Both Stanley and Samuel were managers of the American Sales Company, dealers in used cars and tires at 30 South Seventh (could this be a typo?). Several years later Stanley owned the Richmond Wholesale Tire Company at 29 North Seventh. In 1927-28 the couple (Edna and Stanley) are listed as living here alone. Stanley evidently dies soon thereafter (have not checked obituaries); the house is listed as vacant in 1930. Their son, Robert M. Lives with his mother until about 1941.
- Edna is listed as being a widow in the 1931 City Directory. She works at the Hoosier Mercantile Company and lives here with Robert, who is a student. Hoosier Mercantile is a department/dry goods store that sells "notions, millinery, shoes, chinaware, etc." Robert goes to work at Sears as a salesman by 1935. Edna takes in a renter, Mrs. Susie Mills (widow of Sherman), by 1937 to split expenses. By 1941 Edna is a department manager and Robert moves across from Earlham College at 600 National Road West. Edna eventually becomes a buyer for the store and retires in 1970. She dies on June 12, 1972 at the age of 84.
- Robert is the sole heir and lives on South Sixteenth. He sells the property to the next couple.









1909 Sanborn Insurance Map
